There are impoverished and homeless people that use the comfy chairs in Alexander Library and there is no reason to kick them out into the cold.

 - "In November 2014, the libraries of Rutgers University New Brunswick adopted a policy excluding from the libraries after 10pm any patron without a Rutgers University I.D. card, a policy which remains in effect. The services of the libraries are used not only by students, faculty, and staff, but by members of the extended University community, and the closure of the libraries to the community has a disproportionate impact on those who are most vulnerable, including those with irregular working hours, the self-taught, the displaced, and the under housed In light of its unjust effects, SEBS Governing Council stands in firm opposition to the libraries' late-night I.D. policy."
- ii. Motion to postpone voting on the resolution until the next meeting.
