- i. Town Halls
 - 1. Public Safety: Scarce on resources so most of the focus is on wards 5 and 6 in the College Avenue area. They are now aware of the security issues present on Cook/Douglass.
 - 2. Commuter/Transportation: So few REXB buses available. Budgets are reviewed for each line and are open to revision.
 - a. White buses are present because some of our regular Rutgers buses are in Newark.
 - 3. Housing and Dining (Esther): Really informative. Talked about the low quality of residence halls on Cook. There are ongoing new renovations and lists of buildings to go through for renovation on a cycle. Sustainability is a recurring theme among the dining halls with the use of reusable takeout containers as a start. Dining halls are having trouble getting students to participate in new initiatives. Referenced master plan and talked about the need for study centers.
 - a. Asbestos: Don't bang on your wall or disrupt buildings.
