Largest School Enrollment

- 3,777 Fall Enrollment- 100 more than ever been
- Same metrics as SAS
- Quite plan to increase the school to 4,000
- o Almost 1000 students introduced to SEBS

Budget Cuts instead having a surplus, very large deficit

- The legislators allocated \$10 M would go to RU Camden and RU Newark
- Things will be tight this year and next and do everything
- \$1.6 M Deficit- change in appropriation
- For \$1, central keeps .4 and the rest is distributed among the school. 30% of the tuition paid for the school, 70% toward the school in which the course is offered; change would be 75% school in which class is offered, 25% toward SEBS-This 5% change results in a \$1M deficit.
