 - i. New university-wide sustainability committee has put together a report addressing sustainability. University Facilities picked up in 2011 with a sustainability model for about 25 years that includes various projects both being worked on currently and moving forward. When approached, President Barchi was happy to take on a university-wide goal of sustainability. The committee also sent out invitations to various faculty students staff
 - 1. The committee has a Sakai website, and will eventually have a Facebook page. A list of members may be placed on the Facilities website.
 - ii. It is recommend that students start looking into The Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE) and see what other universities are doing. Lots of things are happening all over the nation. There will be a meeting in Portland next month. Rutgers is trying to work with them and bring more sustainable practices to the university. The STARS program is used by Princeton Review and Sierra Club, and in past years, we have had a B rating.
 - iii. Rutgers is improving greatly with carbon reduction (the university has an understanding with the EPA about our carbon footprint) and we are #1 reducer of CO2 (nearly 43 million dollars) out of colleges in the U.S.
 - iv. Various other programs are being implemented. For example, every light bulb and fixture will have to be changed, as funding is available.
 - v. Close to \$2 million will be spent on renovations very soon. Through NJ clean energy, 200 motors were installed within the new business school building and 31 major buildings were renovated in the recent past.
 - vi. Ten megawatts of solar power are produced on the Livingston campus and geothermal energy is currently in use in the business school building.

- vii. The new chemistry building will be LEED Gold certified, and the three buildings on College Avenue will be LEED silver certified according to standards set by the U.S. Green Building Council.
