 - a. Academic Affairs
 - i. Meeting with Career Services took place two weeks ago with Janet Jones, the Director of Employer Relations, Larry Jacobs, Career Development Specialist, and Kristen Lester from the SEBS SPIN program.
 - 1. Cluster career fairs from last year are no longer in place. One mega fair will be held on Thursday, January 29th and 30th from 12 to 5 PM in the Sonny Werblin Recreation Center. There is no longer a SEBS mini fair and many SEBS majors don't feel represented in larger career fairs since there are not a lot of companies present that hire from these majors. Career Services believes that smaller companies don't want to pay the money to come to career fair.
 - a. Life After College event on January 25th is a good opportunity to network and the Cook Alumni Association will try to go look for alumni out there for a specific major.
 - 2. Agreed upon an alumni networking event in which alumni come and invite contacts that they have from past employers as well as faculty and their contacts to serve as an informal SEBS career fair.
