Organization Overview:

The Douglass Black Students' Congress, often abbreviated to DBSC, was founded in the spring of 1968 as the oldest and largest Black Women's organization at Rutgers University. The mission of the Douglass Black Students' Congress is to address the intellectual, political, and social needs of all Black students at Douglass College through social activities, roundtable discussions, professional panels, community service projects, and other creative and innovative programming.

As women of their business, Douglass Black Students' Congress fulfill their mission and students throughout Rutgers University through a series of events including: community service, monthly "Black Thoughts", and their annual "Kwanzaa Ball".

Event Overview:

Kwanzaa was created in 1966 by Dr. Maulana Karenga, professor and chairman of Black Studies at California State University, Long Beach. After the Watts riots in Los Angeles, Dr. Karenga searched for ways to bring African-Americans together as a community. Karenga combined aspects of the Ashanti and those of the Zulu harvesting celebrations to form the basis of Kwanzaa. A celebration to unite the entire Black community-- the Douglass Black Students' Congress hosts the annual Kwanzaa Ball to unite the Black community at Rutgers University and its surrounding. The night is composed of vendors, the presentation of the seven principles of Kwanzaa, and enriching culture.

For the Douglass Black Students' Congress this will be our 14th annual Kwanzaa Ball. This year's banquet will also mark the beginning of our <u>50th year anniversary</u>. As we hope to put on an event which builds upon the principle of Unity, we aim to build upon the unity at Rutgers, between campuses, student organizations and generations of students of color.

Statement of Need:

In order to successfully put together this event, we are asking for your help in promoting and financing the event. As an organization we are able to put up \$2000. We ask our cosponsors to aid in the remaining.

We understand that not every organization is in the capacity to make extreme donations and so if monetary donations are not possible, we still ask for help in terms of promotional help. We will be sending out social media flyers marketing our tabling, bake sale tables, and the event. We ask that your organization help market our Kwanzaa Ball. It is important that if you select the promotional option that your organization actually PROMOTE and ATTEND.

Cosponsorship Expectations

We ask that student co-sponsors present a Kwanzaa Principle along with promotion of the event.

- A representative from each organization would briefly speak upon given principle regarding its importance to your organization.
- Five or more members to attend our event.

We also ask that *if* possible STUDENT provide anywhere from \$30-\$75 to go towards expenses. A breakdown of our expenses is listed below.

Projected Budget & Expenses:

Dinner: \$5,000

The price listed above is set to accommodate our expected 200 guests, and take into consideration the cost of cultural catering and food service.

Entertainment \$1100

This includes the pricing for the DJ, our tradition of having a dance troupe, as our well as our photographer. Under Entertainment this expense also takes into account the cost of sponsoring our clothing, natural skin care, and other potential Black vendors.

Space and Setup: \$900

This includes the fee set by the Meetings & Events Office to use the Trayes Hall of the Douglass Student Center. This also covers the costs of additional student center equipment such as the medium stage, house sound, microphones, table cloths, setup charges, and wristbands.

Flyers and Tickets: \$285

This includes production costs of flyers and the cost of ticketing. Tickets will be \$5 for Rutgers students, \$8 and for Alumni and non-university as well as at the door.

Decorations: \$800

Decoration prices are accounting for our backdrop, a geofilter, centerpieces, and artwork to hold around the venue.
